The Chairman of the Drafting Committee presented the report of the Drafting Committee on Diplomatic protection ([A/CN.4/L.647](#) and [A/CN.4/L.647/Add.1](#)). The Commission considered the report and adopted, on first reading, a complete set of draft articles on Diplomatic protection (article 1 (Definition and scope); article 2 (Right to exercise diplomatic protection); article 3 (Protection by the State of nationality); article 4 (State of nationality of a natural person); article 5 (Continuous nationality); article 6 (Multiple nationality and claim against a third State); article 7 (Multiple nationality and claim against a State of nationality); article 8 (Stateless persons and refugees); article 9 (State of nationality of a corporation); article 10 (Continuous nationality of a corporation); article 11 (Protection of shareholders); article 12 (Direct injury to shareholders); article 13 (Other legal persons); article 14 (Exhaustion of local remedies); article 15 (Category of claims); article 16 (Exceptions to the local remedies rule); article 17 (Actions or procedures other than diplomatic protection); article 18 (Special treaty provisions); and article 19 (Ships' crews)).

The Commission then approved the text of the draft decision and recommended it to the Economic and Social Council for adoption.

The Commission thus concluded its consideration of agenda item 2.
